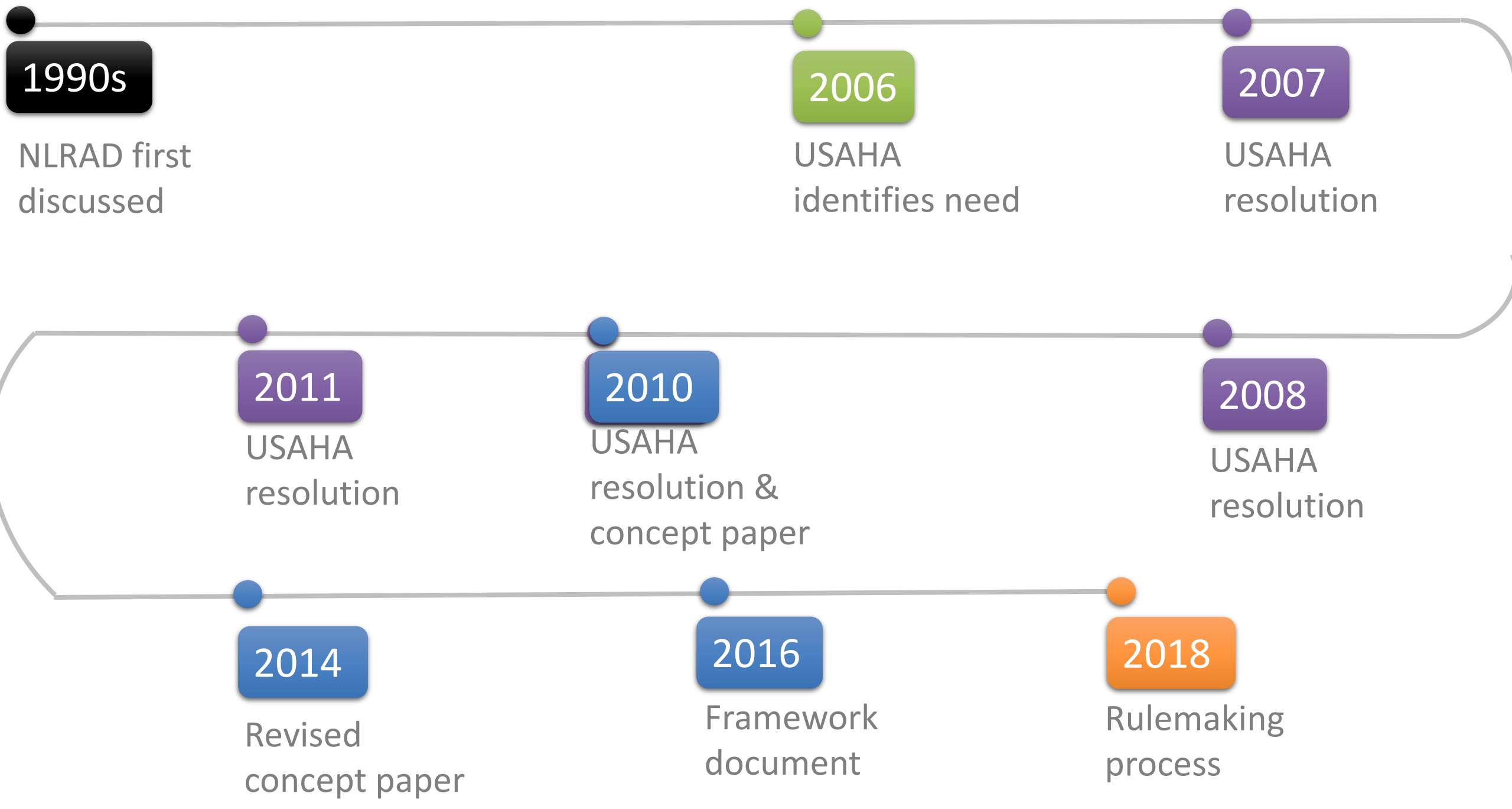

Standard for Laboratory Testing OIE Manual, Ch. 2.1.9. – Reporting Criteria Presumptive diagnosis is based on compatible clinical signs plus positive serology (cELISA or SN). Definitive diagnosis requires virus isolation and characterization.
