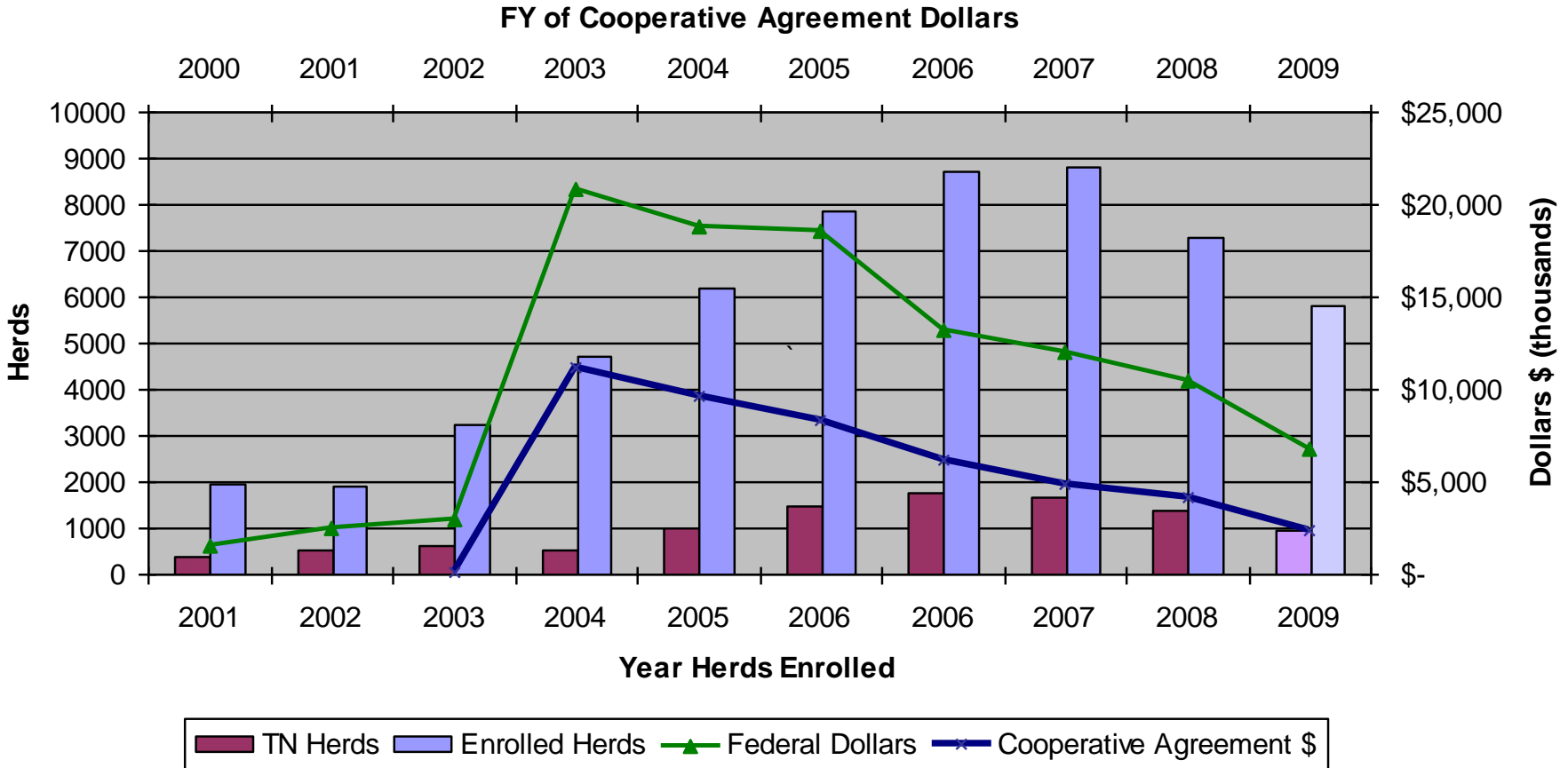

What are States doing?

- ▶ Several states indicated a “basic” shut down of the program due to lack of funding.

BUT others reported:

- ▶ Looking to other options for information and program delivery – Extension, NAIS coordinator, DHIA
- ▶ Using the JEI dairy and beef newsletters
- ▶ Use of state funds for activities. 16 of the 32 states reported some state funding. ~ \$3m

What is industry doing?

- ▶ You will hear more about some of the things from other speakers today
- ▶ Producer meetings that include discussion of Johne's disease and control efforts
- ▶ Providing information in hard copy and electronically
- ▶ WMMB funded Hoard's insert on WI demonstration herds and practices that work
- ▶ IDFA established a MAP Task Force
- ▶ Funding research

What is industry doing?

- ▶ DHIA – Milk ELISA testing
 - 2008 samples run 188,437
 - 2009 samples run 207,033

10% increase without subsidies
- ▶ Technician training
- ▶ Providing management reports for producers

What does not appear to be happening?

- ▶ Discussion of the Strategic Plan
 - 1 beef and 1 dairy organization reported being aware of the plan
- ▶ Discussion of funding and program priorities
 - 4 beef and 2 dairy organizations reported discussion of funding with their DJCs

Assets available for use

- ▶ The 32 states reported 1,434 Johne's certified veterinarians available to work with producers
- ▶ Approved labs are available to producers in all states to run diagnostic samples
- ▶ DHIA milk ELISA testing is available to dairy producers in all areas
- ▶ Producer organizations are willing to provide information
- ▶ Trade media are interested in information
- ▶ JDIP is funding innovative research

Summary

- ▶ Funding cuts are impacting the program
- ▶ Johne's remains a significant challenge and cost for producers
- ▶ Infrastructure has been developed and is available to help producers address Johne's
- ▶ We need to explore innovative ways to best use the resources that are available
